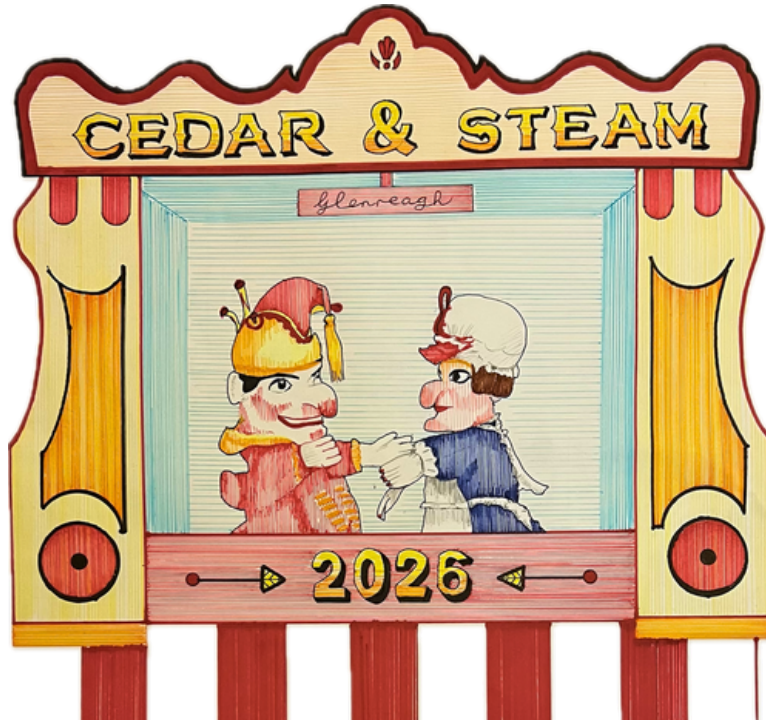

UNDERSTANDING DIVISION 296: WHAT NEW SUPER TAX MEANS FOR AUSTRALIANS

Division 296 is a new tax aimed at people with very large superannuation balances. In broad terms, it reduces the tax concessions available to individuals whose total super balance is above \$3 million. The legislation passed Parliament on 10 March 2026 and received Royal Assent on 13 March 2026. It applies from 1 July 2026.

For most Australians, Division 296 will make no difference at all. It is targeted at a group of people with high super balances. If your total super balance is under \$3 million at the end of the financial year, this new measure does not apply to you.

So, what actually changes? Division 296 imposes an additional 15% tax on the share of a person's super earnings that relates to the part of their balance above \$3 million. The new law also adds a further 10% tax for the share of earnings attributable to balances above \$10 million. In other words, the higher the balance above those thresholds, the more the concessional treatment of super is reduced.

One reason Division 296 has attracted attention is that the calculation is based on a person's total superannuation balance. That means the measure can capture growth in asset values inside super, even where the assets have not been sold. Critics argue it may create cash-flow pressure, especially for people whose super is invested in illiquid assets such as business property or farms through a self-managed super fund.

Importantly, Division 296 does not mean your entire super balance is taxed at the new rate. The extra tax only applies to the proportion of earnings linked to the part of the balance above the relevant threshold. It also does not affect the ordinary operation of super for the vast majority of workers and retirees. Employer contributions, standard concessional tax treatment, and the basic purpose of super remain unchanged for people below the thresholds.

Although the law starts from 1 July 2026, the first practical impact will be felt later, because the rules apply to income years starting on that date. In effect, the first measurement year is 2026–27, with assessments arising after the end of that financial year.

Division 296 is not a broad new tax on super. It is a targeted change focused on large balances. People with balances approaching or exceeding the thresholds should get tailored advice, particularly where they hold assets through an SMSF or are considering major contribution, pension, or restructuring decisions.

CEDAR & STEAM

Glenreagh Museum's art and photo exhibition, Cedar and Steam, will be held in the Glenreagh School of Arts (the Hall) on Friday evening 26th, Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th June.



People's Choice was a well received advent to last year's exhibition. The first place winners of all the 7 categories, in both the Open and Youth sections, were pitted against each other for the accolade of the most popular entry to earn the recognition of GRAND CHAMPION of Cedar and Steam for 2025.

Eight year old, Lily Arjonilla, won the Youth section with a delightful black and white photo called 'The Daily Squawk' of her brother and the family's rooster. Chantal Kemsley's painting, 'Hope', was chosen as the overall winner in the Open section. Lily and Chantal will have the honour of handing over the perpetual trophy to this year's people's choice grand champions at the closing of the exhibition on Sunday afternoon at 2pm.



Entries are being received for all the 5 general categories - photography, painting drawing, fibre and 3D sculpture. This year's special category is PUPPETS. Puppets can be made from a sock or a paper bag. They can be made to fit a finger or jump out of a box. There can be shadow puppets or marionettes that are operated by strings. Also the puppets could be entered as a photo, drawing or painting that capture the concept of story telling with movement. Puppets are open to youth and adults to enter so come and see how this child friendly art form can entertain all ages. The seven hinterland, valley primary schools and homeschoolers have also been invited to enter their puppets. So the Hall will be bursting with colour and creativity. All of the six categories are judged by folk who are well recognized in their field of expertise.

Two Guest Artists have been invited to display their passion and talents. A well recognized local painter, Guy Gilmore, will have a retrospective exhibition of some of his works that have been shown nationally. The paintings feature family and friends, farmers in their comfortably familiar hats, working men and women growing food and tending livestock in the beautifully and serene Orara Valley.

Wayne Wilson will display a selection of his control line aeroplanes, each individually modelled on real aircraft. Control line model aircraft are radio-controlled planes flown on two thin wires attached to a handle. Wayne has been working on a model of a plane that was built and flown in Glenreagh in the 1930s. A great deal of research has been needed as plans were minimal and records sketchy. Wayne has diligently recreated this aircraft and it will have it's inaugural showing at Cedar and Steam.

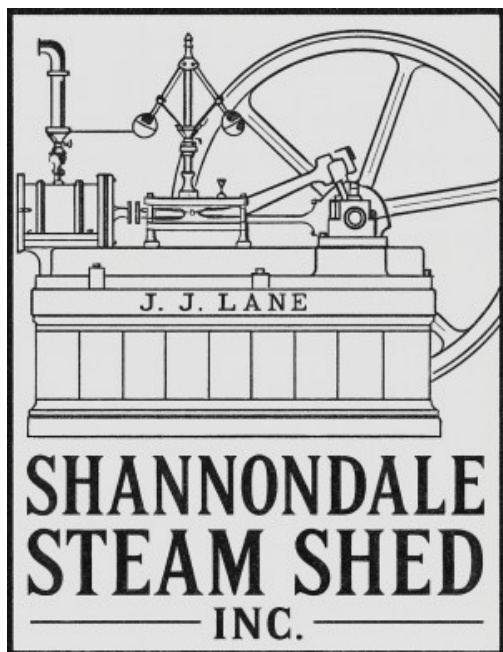


Did you know?

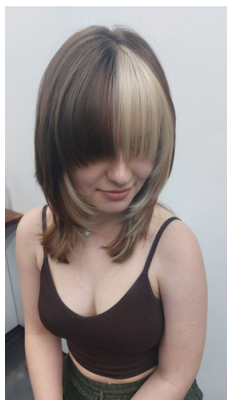

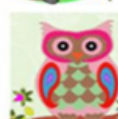

ROAD CLOSURE NOTIFICATION

Dear Glenreagh Residents,

As preparations begin for the upcoming Glenreagh Timber Festival, we would like to thank our local community for your ongoing support and understanding as we host one of the .region's most anticipated events

To ensure the safety of residents, visitors, volunteers and event participants, temporary road closures and traffic management measures will be in place on **Saturday 25 July 2026 from approximately 6:30am to 5:30pm.**

The following roads will be affected:

- Bridge Street
- Boundary Street
- Dorrigo Street

These areas will remain accessible to local traffic, with qualified traffic controllers on site throughout the day to assist residents, pedestrians and festival attendees.

To help reduce congestion within the village, vehicles travelling along Coramba Street will be directed via Boundary Street and Dorrigo Street, while festival traffic will be diverted via Tallawudjah Road to access the designated event parking area adjacent to the Glenreagh Recreation Grounds.

We understand that road closures can cause some inconvenience and have worked closely with local authorities and traffic management providers to minimise disruption wherever possible. Clear signage and traffic controllers will be in place to assist motorists and ensure access for residents is maintained.
