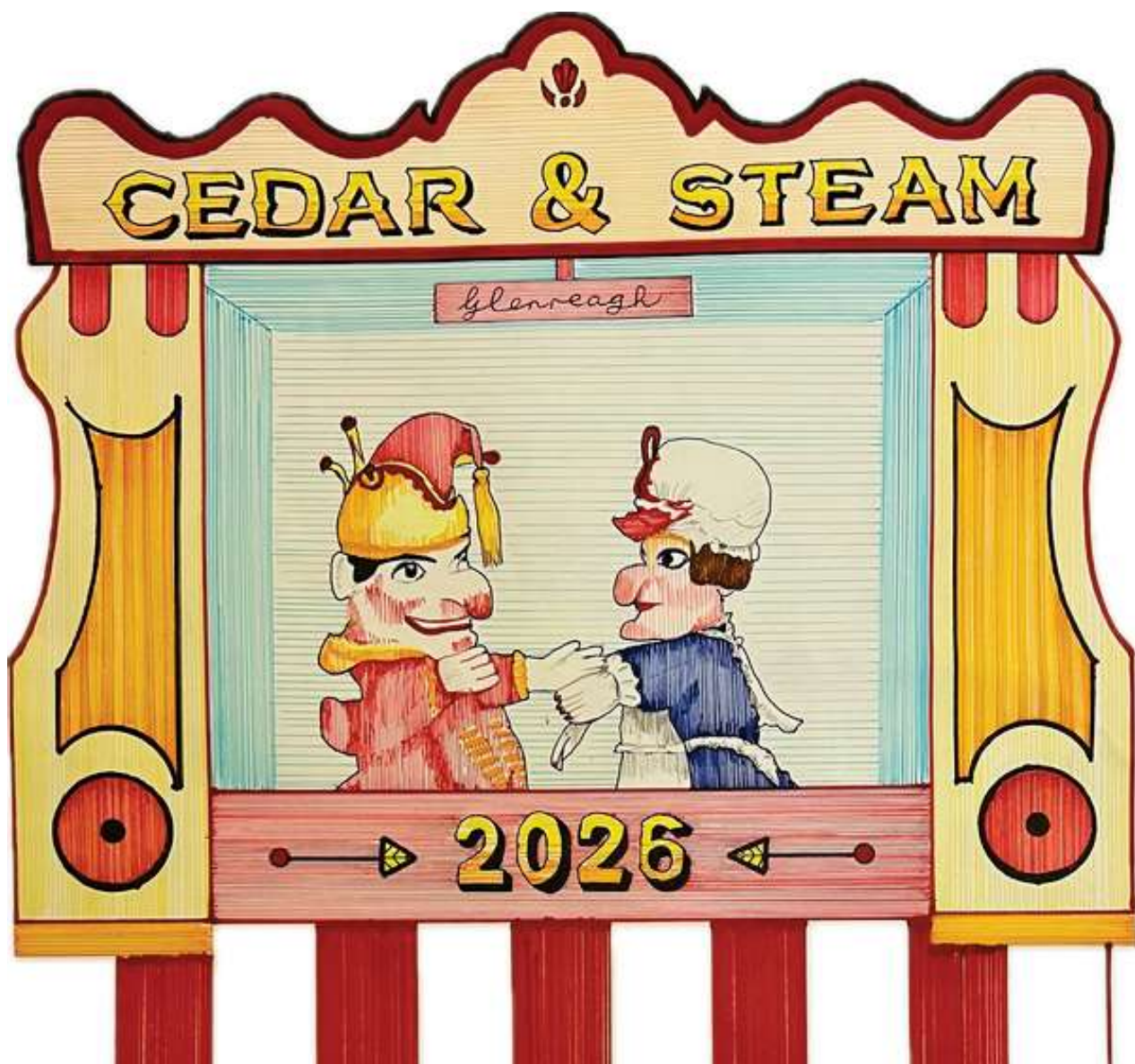

## MUSEUM NEWS

The Museum's annual art and photo exhibition, Cedar and Steam, will be held on the 26-28th June. Entry forms have been mailed out electronically as well as via snail mail. If you would like to showcase your creativity in photography, painting, drawing, fibre or 3D sculpture then we would love to receive your entries. This year's special category is puppets. Lots of the children have been busy making puppets and I have heard that a Glenreagh school teacher has motivated her class to make some very interesting, personalised puppets. This is open for all ages so, adults, let your inner child out of hiding and create a whimsical puppet.

There will be kid's creative workshop in the Hall on Saturday morning 23rd May to encourage local children to enter Cedar and Steam. It will cost \$15 per child to cover the cost of all the art materials.




Do you really wish to record precious memories from an older family member...before the opportunity passes? The Museum will be running a one-day Oral History Collection workshop on Tuesday 7th July in the Glenreagh Hall. This will be run by the Clarence Valley Council's Historian, Kate Gahan. She will teach us how to formulate appropriate questions that will encourage the person being interviewed to "spill the beans" and share their story... how to sequence the questions, when to shut up and let the person talk, how to record the information gleaned etc. Kate will also teach us how and when to introduce photographs and how to successfully interview a couple together so that it doesn't turn into a marital dispute. She will also share tips on how to protect those valuable family photo albums that are falling to pieces and contain insufficient explanations of the photos. ### ***Did you know?***

Museum – The Glenreagh General Store Cabinet  
In the museum stands a large timber display cabinet, once a feature of the original Glenreagh General Store.

During the 1920s and 1930s, it was used to display fashion items, including gloves and millinery, behind its glass panels.

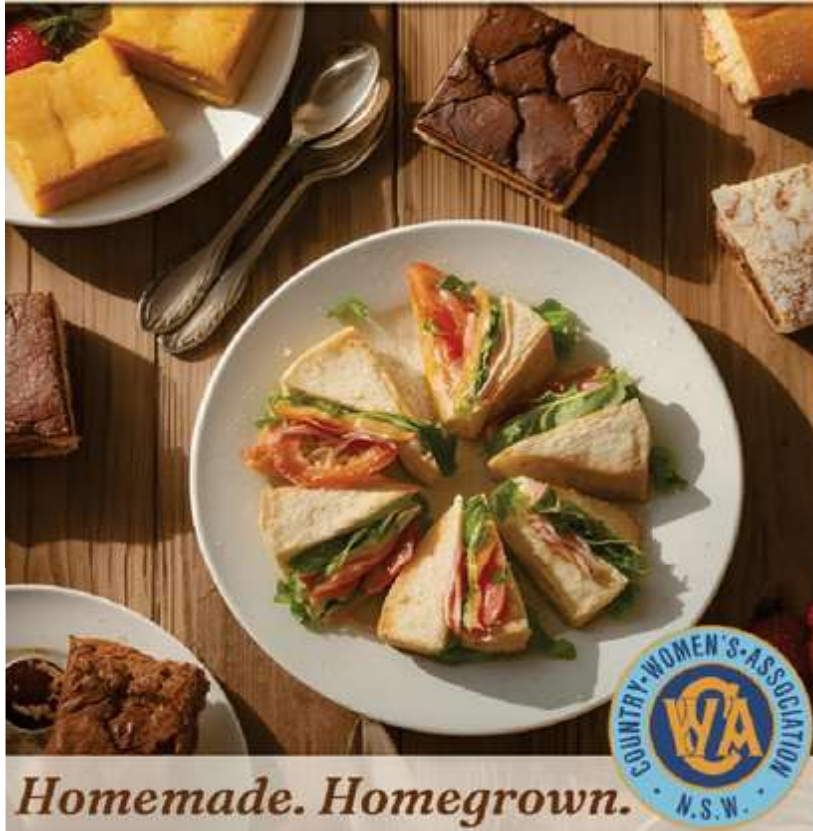
The cabinet was restored in 1987 and now sits in the museum, displaying old cameras. If you look carefully, you may also spot an original glass negative, which the museum has recently had printed. It reveals a beautiful photograph of a young boy, likely taken in the 1930s.

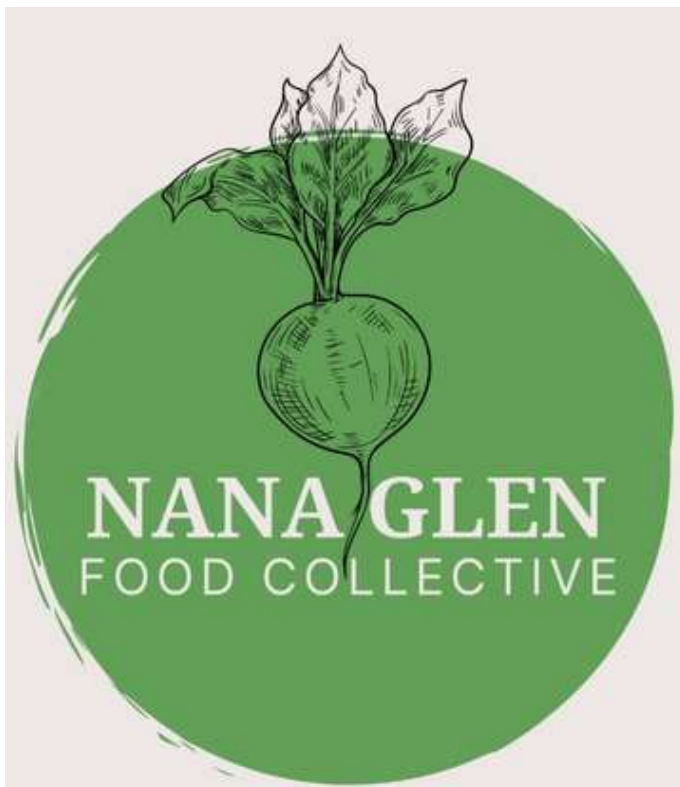

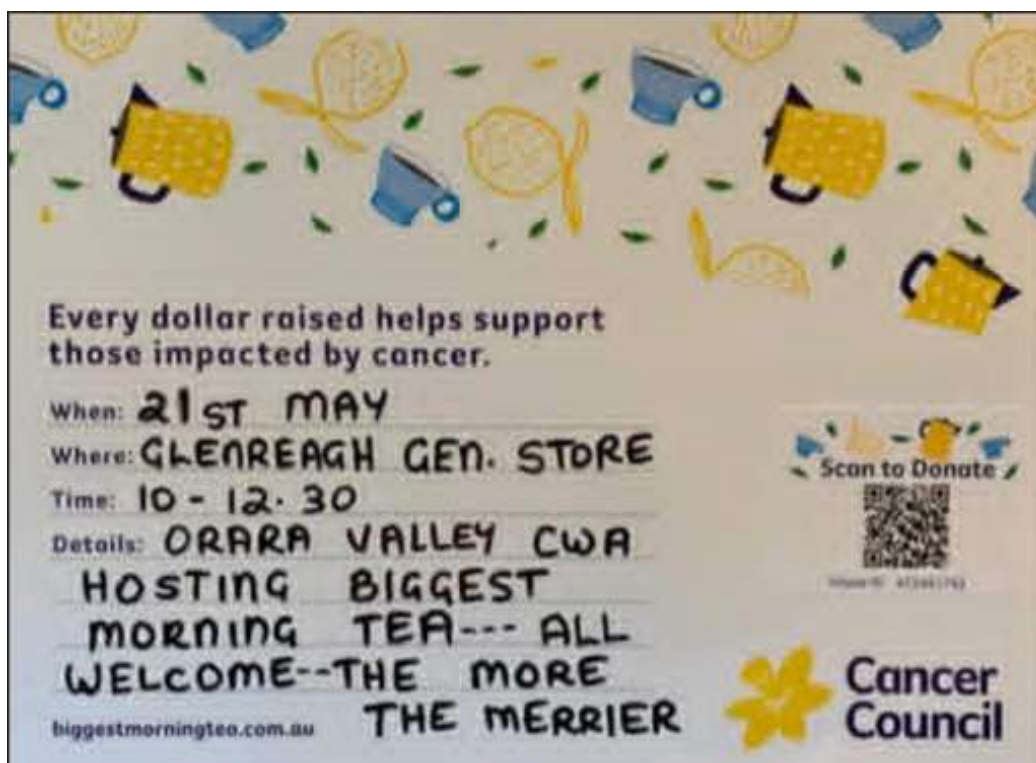
## ORARA VALLEY CWA NEWS

# FEDERAL BUDGET 2026–27: KEY TAX MEASURES AND WHAT THEY MEAN FOR AUSTRALIANS

The 2026–27 Federal Budget gives accountants, business owners and investors plenty to think about. While broader spending initiatives covered defence, aged care and fuel security, the major announcements were overwhelmingly tax-related. We summarise a few of the key proposed changes below.

## Personal Tax

The Government confirmed additional personal income tax relief measures, including the previously legislated reduction in the lowest marginal tax rate from 16% to 15% from 1 July 2026 and a further reduction to 14% from 1 July 2027.

The Budget introduced a new \$250 Working Australians Tax Offset commencing in 2027–28 for approximately 13 million taxpayers.

The Government also drafted legislation to introduce a standard tax deduction of \$1,000 for work related expenses from the 2027 income year. These items will not need to be substantiated or itemised.

The higher Private Health insurance Rebate for individuals over 65 years will be removed from 1 April 2027.

## Major Housing Tax Reforms

The centrepiece of the Budget was the Government's overhaul of property taxation arrangements.

### Negative gearing changes

From 1 July 2027, losses from established residential properties acquired after Budget night will only be deductible against:

- rental income, or
- future capital gains from residential property.

Excess losses will be carried forward.

The new rules will not apply to:

- existing properties acquired before 7:30pm AEST on 12 May 2026,
- eligible new builds,
- superannuation funds,
- widely held trusts,
- certain build-to-rent developments.

## Replacement of the 50% CGT Discount

From 1 July 2027, the current 50% CGT discount will be replaced with a cost base indexation model for assets held longer than 12 months. A minimum 30% tax on net capital gains will also apply.

Importantly:

- Transitional rules will preserve the current 50% discount for gains accrued before 1 July 2027.
- Pre-CGT assets will remain exempt for gains accrued before that date.
- Investors in new residential property may choose between:
  - o the existing 50% discount, or
  - o indexation plus the 30% minimum tax.

Clients with substantial unrealised capital gains should consider reviewing:

- investment holding structures,
- planned disposal strategies,
- succession and estate planning arrangements.

## Trust Taxation Changes

The Budget announced a proposed 30% minimum tax rate on discretionary trust distributions, expected to commence from 1 July 2028.

Under the proposal:

- trustees will pay a minimum 30% tax on trust taxable income,
- individual beneficiaries will receive non-refundable tax credits,
- corporate beneficiaries will not be able to claim credits for tax already paid by the trustee.

## Exclusions

The measure will not apply to:

- fixed trusts,
- complying superannuation funds,
- deceased estates,
- special disability trusts,
- certain primary production and vulnerable beneficiary arrangements.

Expanded rollover relief will be available for three years from 1 July 2027 to assist businesses restructuring out of discretionary trusts.

Many private groups may need to reconsider long-term business and investment structures before the commencement date.

## **Business Tax Measures**

### **Permanent instant asset write-off**

The Budget confirmed the continuation of the instant asset write-off regime for small business, with a permanent \$20,000 threshold.

Eligible small businesses can continue to immediately deduct qualifying depreciating assets rather than claiming deductions over multiple years.

### **Loss Carry Back Returns**

Companies with turnover below \$1 billion will again be able to carry back revenue tax losses for up to two years from 1 July 2026.

This provides:

- improved cash flow support,
- access to refunds of prior year tax paid.

### **Electric Vehicle (EV) FBT Changes**

The Government announced a gradual rollback of electric vehicle fringe benefits tax concessions. From April 2027:

- the full FBT exemption will only apply to EVs under \$75,000,
- EVs above \$75,000 will receive a 25% concession.

Further reductions apply from 2029.

Businesses and employees using novated lease arrangements may wish to review vehicle procurement timing before concession reductions apply.

While many measures still require legislation, the proposed reforms are substantial and will likely drive significant restructuring and planning activity over the next two years.

Taxpayers, investors and business owners should seek advice early to assess:

- the impact of the proposed CGT and negative gearing reforms,
- trust restructuring opportunities,
- investment acquisition timing,

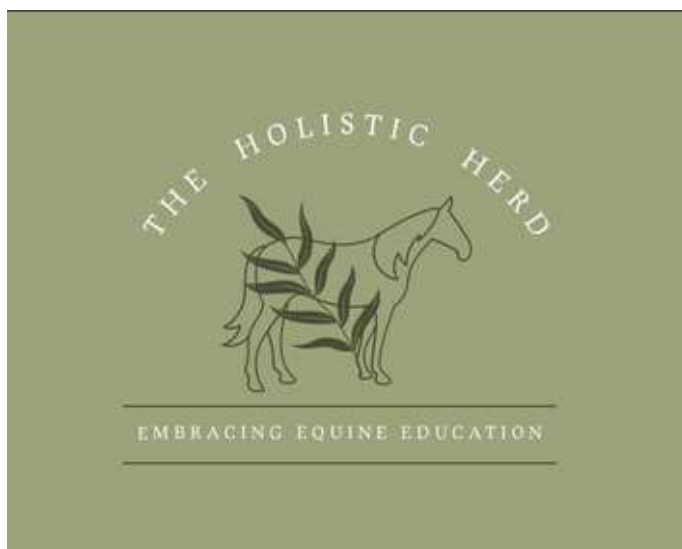
